Erik R. Hanson, Peterborough, Ontario BA, MA

Erik Hanson is the Heritage Resources Coordinator for the City of Peterborough, Ontario, where he manages heritage programming, archaeological activity and municipal cultural planning. He holds a Masters of Science degree in Historic Preservation from the University of Vermont at Burlington, and a Bachelors degree in History from Trent University.

His work has included time spent in New Orleans after hurricane Katrina as a member of a damage assessment team coordinated by the National Trust for Historic Preservation.

Stuart Lazear is a professional planner with heritage planning experience at the community, local, provincial and federal levels across Canada spanning forty years. As the Coordinator of Heritage Planning Services for the City of Ottawa from 1989 until 2013 he supervised a team of heritage planning professionals responsible for the identification, protection and management of built heritage resources in the nation's capital.

For the past five years he has taught courses in Heritage Preservation and Adaptive Reuse at Algonquin College and is currently an Adjunct Professor in the School of Canadian Studies at Carleton University where he teaches a course titled *Introduction to Heritage Conservation in Canada*.

Stuart has served on the board of the Society for the Study of Architecture in Canada as well as community advocacy groups including Heritage Regina, Heritage Montreal and Heritage Ottawa.

Dr Matthew Hardy is Senior Lecturer in Architecture and Urbanism at the Prince's Foundation for Building Community. After working at the Foundation to establish INTBAU (International Network for Traditional Building, Architecture & Urbanism) from 2000, he served as its Secretary until 2009 when he returned to run the Foundation's academic education programs.

Matthew has lectured and published widely in support of INTBAU, editing *The Venice Charter Revisited* in 2011, and has taught on both course work and summer programs as a Visiting Research Associate at Oxford University, Visiting Professor at the University of Notre Dame, and Lecturer at the University of South Australia. He maintained a practice in architecture and urban design in Europe and Australia after registering as an architect in Australia in 1983.

Matthew is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts, a Fellow of the Royal Australian Institute of Architects, and an International Member of the Royal Institute of British Architects. He is co-founder and co-editor of Journal of Urbanism, published by Routledge.
