

## **Members of the Jury – Prince of Wales Prize for Municipal Heritage Leadership**

### **Shannie Duff, St. John's Newfoundland and Labrador**

Shannie Duff entered municipal politics in St. John's, Newfoundland and Labrador in 1977 and has served as Mayor, Deputy Mayor and Councillor. She currently chairs three standing committees of council: Heritage Advisory, Arts Advisory and Parks and Recreation. Ms. Duff has also served as a Member of the House of Assembly for St. John's East.

Shannie Duff has been extensively involved in volunteer activities and was founding member of many organizations that have contributed to St. John's growth as a sustainable community, including Cabot Habitat for Humanity, the Newfoundland Historic Trust, the St. John's Heritage Foundation, and the Quidi Vidi Development Foundation. She has received numerous awards throughout her career, including the Order of Canada in 2003.

The City of St. John's is the 2007 recipient of the Prince of Wales Prize for Municipal Heritage Leadership.

### **Stuart Lazear, Ottawa, Ontario MA, MCIP, RPP**

Stuart Lazear is a professional planner with heritage planning experience at the community, local, provincial and federal levels across Canada spanning forty years. As the Coordinator of Heritage Planning Services for the City of Ottawa from 1989 until 2013 he supervised a team of heritage planning professionals responsible for the identification, protection and management of built heritage resources in the nation's capital.

For the past five years he has taught courses in Heritage Preservation and Adaptive Reuse at Algonquin College and is currently an Adjunct Professor in the School of Canadian Studies at Carleton University where he teaches a course titled *Introduction to Heritage Conservation in Canada*.

Stuart has served on the board of the Society for the Study of Architecture in Canada as well as community advocacy groups including Heritage Regina, Heritage Montreal and Heritage Ottawa.

### **Erik R. Hanson, Peterborough, Ontario**

Erik Hanson is the Heritage Resources Coordinator for the City of Peterborough, Ontario, where he manages heritage programming, archaeological activity and municipal cultural planning. He holds a Masters of Science degree in Historic Preservation from the University of Vermont at Burlington, and a Bachelors degree in History from Trent University.

Erik has a personal interest in the value of heritage preservation as a mechanism for social justice and community social well being. His work has included time spent in New Orleans after hurricane Katrina as a member of a damage assessment team coordinated by the National Trust for Historic Preservation.
